To qualify, veterans:

- May be single or part of a family or household
- Must earn 50% or less of their community's median income
- May reside in permanent housing, but be at risk of homelessness
- May be homeless, but ready to move in to permanent housing
- Must have a discharge status other than dishonorable

Program services include:

- Outreach to veterans
- Case management
- Help applying for Veteran's Administration assistance and other benefits
- Financial assistance to secure or preserve housing
- Help connecting veterans with other community resources and services

Perishable items are often the least donated, yet they are the most needed to prepare healthy, balanced meals. The Community Action Partnership of North Dakota Sportsmen Against Hunger Program is proud to bring together generous hunters, willing to donate game meat with families who can benefit from no-cost, nutritious protein sources by organizing the donation of legally obtained wild game to food pantries across North Dakota.

IS THIS FOOD EXPIRED?

UNDERSTANDING DATE LABELS

The dates that food companies put on packages are not regulated and do not mean that the food is unsafe to eat, except in the case of baby formula. Most foods are still tasty and nutritious after the date has passed. Not sure if food is spoiled? Check for off odor, flavor or texture.

"BEST BY" OR "BEST IF USED BY" DATE

This date tells you when the food will have the best flavor. It is still safe to eat past this date.

"USE BY" OR "EXPIRATION" DATE

This is the last date that the product will be at its peak quality. It is still safe to eat past this date (except for baby formula).

"PACKING/MANUFACTURING" DATE

This is the date used by manufacturers for tracking. It is not an expiration date - it is not related to food quality or safety.

"SELL BY" DATE

This tells the store how long to display the product for sale.

It is still safe to eat past this date.

GOOD FOR UP TO ONE YEAR AFTER THE DATE:

- · Packaged food like cereal, pasta, dried beans, and baking mixes
- Frozen foods
- Canned goods including soup, condiments, meat, fruit, and vegetables

GOOD FOR UP TO 30 DAYS AFTER THE DATE:

- Butter
- Cheese
- Eggs

GOOD FOR UP TO SEVEN DAYS AFTER THE DATE:

- Milk
- Yogurt
- · Cream Cheese

An individual may place an order for up to 8 items per week but not more than 2 of any one item Orders received by 5 pm on Thursday will be available for pick up **Monday from 5-5:30 at Souris Valley United Way.** If your child attends Minot Public Schools, your order may be picked up at their school during the school year, rather than at Souris Valley United Way. If you wish to have your items delivered to your child's school, please notate that in your email or text.

DID YOU KNOW?

Homeless prevention services are a huge part of what we do at the Men's Winter Refuge. We provide year-round services for those in need -- such as free weekly rides (every Wednesday) to the Lord's Cupboard food pantry, and giving away free men's clothing. Each year for the past three years, we have helped between 800 and 1,000 individuals in the Minot area with our homeless prevention services -- that's IN ADDITION to those we serve in our men's homeless shelter. We are the last resort, after all other resources have been exhausted. If there is no other shelter option and needs are emergent but short term, we may be able to provide short-term, emergency shelter on a case by case basis. Services also include information and referral, budgeting and collaboration when needed. The Minot Area Homeless Coalition, Inc. is not a shelter and cannot provide housing. Please call to schedule an appointment."

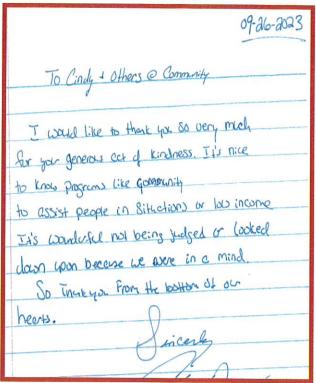

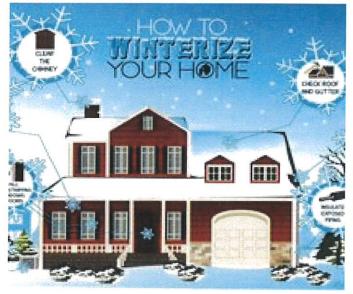

Are your energy bills through the roof?!

Community Action's free Weatherization program may be able to help!

Weatherization provides energy conservation services to eligible homeowners and renters. The program helps to increase energy efficiency and reduce heating bills by concentrating on the problems of heat loss and air infiltration. Weatherization services, such as insulation, caulking, and weather-stripping are installed by our trained construction crew. You must be income eligible and live in one of the following counties: Burke, Renville, Bottineau, Pierce, McHenry, Ward, Mountrail, or the Fort Berthold Reservation. If you receive fuel assistance from Social Services, then you are automatically income-qualified for the Weatherization program.

If you are interested in receiving Weatherization services, apply at Community Action to determine if you are eligible.

- If you get approved, your home will be inspected to determine what kind of work can be done.
- . One of our Estimators will call you & set up a time for the work to be done by our crew.
- · Once the work is completed, it will be inspected to ensure that all of the work was completed to satisfy the state and federal standards.

If you receive one of these notices in the mail and need assistance take these steps.

- 1. Apply for "Emergency LIHEAP" through the County Social Service Zone that you live in.
- 2. Once you are accepted on the LIHEAP **Program call Community Action** Partnership at 701-839-7221

PLEASE Do NOT wait to call until you get disconnected before you take action.

NDRH Housing Stabilization's focus is helping households experiencing homelessness find long-term stable housing. Once an application has been submitted and approved, the applicant will be matched with a Household Engagement Coach. Applicants will gain an understanding of their lease and Letter of Commitment, and how to have a successful renter and housing provider relationship.

Once applicants are housed, NDRH will assist with three months of rent. During this time, the applicant and coach will look at additional resources around the state to potentially assist with financial needs.

If you qualify, payments will be sent to your housing provider for rent.

Minot Food Pantries

If you are looking to sign up for one of the Minot Food Pantries, you will need to go directly to that pantry. Take with you a photo ID, and proof of residence and number in household. Each pantry has different regulations and times you may use their services.

Free COVID-19 Tests

Self-tests (also called at-home tests and over-the-counter tests) are one of several tools that protect you and others by reducing the chances of spreading COVID-19. Self-tests can be taken at home, work, or anywhere, are easy to use, and produce rapid results.
